

Any map chosen must maintain the City’s current sequence of two 2020 elections and three 2022 elections. The transition to a citywide elected Mayor brings another set of decisions to be made: Two-year versus Four-year Mayoral term?; and initially elect in 2020 or 2022?

If the initial Mayoral election is in 2022, then two Council districts will elect in 2020 and two Council districts will elect in 2022, which is a common and standard approach.

If the initial Mayoral election is in 2020, then going forward either

- A. only one district will elect in 2020 (and every subsequent four years) and three districts will elect in 2022 (and every subsequent four years); or
- B. one district and the mayor will be elected in 2020; two districts will elect a Councilmember to a four-year term in 2022 and every subsequent four years; and one district will elect a Councilmember to a two-year term in 2022, then elect again in 2024 and every subsequent four years.

Where possible, districts with only a single resident current Councilmember, and districts with multiple resident current Councilmembers whose current terms all end in the same year, should be assigned election year sequences that match the resident Councilmember’s term. This approach allows the voters to decide which Councilmembers have earned re-election, rather than district lines blocking the voters from the opportunity to decide whether the Councilmember has earned re-election.

State law requires that proposed election sequence be posted for each map to encourage public discussion of this question, but the following proposed election years are open to change based on public feedback and the questions raised above.
